OUR PURPOSE

- Assist the School Board in the development of long-range plans
- Participate in the development of priorities and strategies
- Submit periodic reports and recommendations
- Assist the Director of Special Education and Related Services in interpreting community plans for services
- Review the special education plan and application for federal funding
- Collaborate with community organizations
